2021/2022 Parish Council Tax - Councillor Graham Tyler, Finance and General Purposes Committee Chairman

At the end of the past year, we look back on what has been an extremely challenging time for the Council's finances. However, in the true spirit of the Council, it has managed to operate effectively and efficiently, as always.

Whilst the majority of personnel members have worked remotely from home, telephone enquiries have continued to be dealt with as swiftly as possible.

The Council's Facebook Page and Website have also provided extremely comprehensive and up-to-date information regarding available and accessible support services and Agencies, plus contact details for local shops, restaurants and other businesses, providing delivery and takeaway services during the Lockdown periods.

I would like to thank the Council's personnel for working unceasingly throughout the Covid-19 crisis.

On a budget that was obviously in decline, with no rental or hiring income, the Council has managed to continue to provide, operate and maintain, the Public Toilets, Floral Displays, Bus and Beach Shelters, the War Memorial, The Woodlands Centre, Recreation Ground and Youth Centre, Samuel Wickens Centre, three Allotment Sites and the most impressive Christmas Lighting Scheme, to mention just a few. A rolling programme of refurbishment of public seats

throughout the Village took place during 2020, the War Memorial was refurbished and the safety surfacing in the Woodlands Recreation Ground Play Area was renewed. With effect from July, the No. 12 Bus Service continued to operate, courtesy of the four-way partnership.

The sale of the home of the old Museum, Church Farm Cottage, did finally reach completion in late February 2020. After settling all associated financial commitments and replenishing the Council's General Fund Balances, an approximate net profit of £244,000.00 was achieved, the majority of which has now had to be ringfenced for capital projects. Whilst none of this has yet been expended, the Council has an extensive Wish List of projects, which includes:

- Replacement Public Toilet Unit - Broadmark Lane
- Replacement Bus Shelter - Sea Lane
- Re-positioning and new surface for Bus Shelter - Station Road
- Refurbishment/upgrading both internally and externally - The Woodlands Centre
- Replacement of equipment - Play Area - Woodlands Recreation Ground
- Refurbishment of Basketball Court/Kickabout Area - Woodlands Recreation Ground

- Replacement Fencing - North Field and Car Park - Woodlands Recreation Ground

The Council will be giving detailed consideration to these projects over the next financial year.

Taking account of the unprecedented period for the Council's operation which, it is anticipated, will continue well into the next financial year, it has maintained all of the seamless services that it provides, albeit much more prudently. The up-shot is that the Council has decided the 2021/2022 Precept should remain the same for the current year, at £690,000.00. This actually represents a very small reduction on the Annual Parish Council charge for a Band 'D' property, which will be approximately £113.00.

In my opinion, the Council continues to be most pro-active, providing excellent value for money, whilst always being mindful of the financial constraints it faces and the burden its expenditure might place on Parishioners.

It just leaves for me to remind you that, members of the local community will have an opportunity, albeit on a virtual basis, to find out more about how the Council spent its Precept during the past year, and how it plans to spend it during the next financial year by 'attending' the Annual Assembly of the Parish Meeting, scheduled to be held on 15 April 2021.

Rustington Museum



On Monday 7 December, the latest temporary Exhibition was opened at Rustington Museum. Harry Clark cut the ribbon to officially open the Exhibition on his life. Harry has played an important part over the years in helping to promote and preserve the history of Rustington. The Exhibition includes memorabilia from his RAF days and his other hobbies. There is also a photography gallery, showcasing some of Harry's Collection and his own exemplary skills.

Even though the Museum is currently closed to the public, the Exhibition will hopefully soon be the first to feature online on the Museum's Website at www.rustingtonmuseum.org. The Exhibition will remain in place at the Museum until Summer 2021 by when it is hoped that many people will have had the opportunity to see it in person.

people who have lived in the Village. There are also occasional puzzles, such as jigsaws and wordsearches to do, so keep looking out for them. It's a great way to contact the Museum with enquiries on subjects like images on postcards, the famous residents and other Museum enquiries. We are always keen to help researchers and school projects with information and images where we can.

The Museum has entered the world of Twitter with @RustingtonMuse1. This is for short snippets of information and images of the Collection. It focuses on the birthdays and death dates of our famous residents like Sir Hubert Parry, national events and joining in with the Museum hashtags like #ObjectSwap and #CuratorBattle. It's a quick way of getting our name out there and creating links with other institutions.

Whilst all of this is happening, we are deep in research for the next Exhibition all about the shops in Rustington. The displays will be full of items from receipts and bags to images telling the story of how the shops have become what they are today. It will also look at what was there before and how the areas have changed. Loo of the Year Awards

The Parish Council continues to win impressive Awards for its Public Toilets



The Parish Council is, once again, delighted to have won one Platinum and three Gold Loo of the Year Awards in the 2020 search to find the best 'away from home' toilets in the UK. The Rustington entries were in the Public Toilets (Non-Attended) Category.

Additional awards, this year, included the Market Sector Award (Car Parks) for the Churchill Car Park, a Premier League Local Authority Award (13th Position), and a Washroom Cleaner of the Year Award - An excellent achievement indeed for all involved.

The Loo of the Year Awards and associated Washroom/Toilet Cleaner of the Year Awards for cleaning staff have been identifying the best toilets/washrooms in Britain since 1987 and are recognised as standard setters for all those who provide 'away from home' facilities for staff, customers and visitors.

Every entry received an unannounced visit from a Loo of the Year Awards Inspector and was assessed against 101 judging criteria - including signage and décor, fixtures and fittings and overall standards of cleanliness and management. Every washroom receives a grading ranging from Bronze to Diamond and Gold, Platinum and Diamond winners are short listed for one or more of several National Awards covering England, Scotland, Wales, Northern Ireland and the Irish Republic.

Class 4 - Front Gardens of Any Size (Commercial)*

Class 5 - Schools' Competition

Class 6 - Community Gardens

*Entries must be clearly visible from the Road

Parishioners and local businesses are encouraged to start thinking about their planting plans now so that they can nominate either themselves, their neighbours, or any members of the local Community for the Competition. Further details will appear in the next issue of this Newsletter.

Individuals, Groups and Organisations from outside of the Parish, who make an outstanding contribution for the benefit of the community of Rustington, may also be considered for these Awards.

These are 'once in a lifetime' Awards and will not be presented on more than one occasion to any Individuals, Groups, Clubs,

Organisations or Associations.
