Rustington Museum at the Samuel Wickens Centre

The Temporary Exhibition 'Rustington Means Business: A History of Retail in the Village' is now fully open. Items from past and present shops are displayed together, showing how Rustington has changed over time. Why not come down and see how many of the shops you remember?

The Museum is always happy to see new items added to the Collection, so check the backs of cupboards for old receipts and bags! We are still looking for information about the old shops in the Village and people's memories to help complete a database. Complimenting the display is a cabinet that will feature a local shop through items from the Collection. Recently donated items include books, receipts and other paraphernalia relating to Barnetts Butchers. Items from this treasure trove will be displayed with photos of the Butchers in its heyday.



The Pub signs for The Windmill and Smugglers Roost are now mounted on the wall in the Local Studies area. Do come and see them following their preservation for the future. The signs were conserved with the aid of a grant from the

AIM Pilgrim Trust Conservation Scheme.

The Virtual Talk Series hosted by the Museum via Zoom is proving very popular. There are a variety of talks from around Sussex and some that focus on Rustington. Wednesday 17 November, 7.00 pm - 9.00 pm Ashley Cooke from Liverpool Museum talks about the Egyptology Collection of Amy Urlin. She often accompanied her sister, Hilda, and Hilda's husband, Flinders Petrie, on digs. The Urlin sisters grew up in Rustington and Petrie stored his Collection in a hut down Sea Lane.

Wednesday 15 December, 2.00 pm - 4.00 pm Caroline Hayward from NTS Kirriemuir, JM Barrie's Birthplace. Explore Barrie's early life and the influences that led to the writing of Peter Pan, and his connection with Cudlow House in the Village.

Wednesday 19 January, 2.00 pm - 4.00 pm Emma Crew from The Jewish Museum. January is when Holocaust Memorial Day is held, and Emma will be telling the stories of Jewish refugees that came to West Sussex. Their Collection also has a doll's house based on a real building in Angmering-on-Sea.

Wednesday 16 February, 2.00 pm - 4.00 pm James Dickinson talks about Pevensey Castle, a Saxon Shore Fort with an incredible history.

Open Monday to Saturday 9.00 am - 5.00 pm (Closed 1.00 pm - 1.30 pm).

New Public Toilet Unit for Broadmark Lane (Southern End)



By the time this Newsletter reaches you it is hoped that a brandnew Toilet Unit will have been installed in Broadmark Lane. The existing unit was closed and taken away for recycling after over 25 years of service at the beginning of October. The delivery of the new unit has been delayed due to circumstances beyond the Parish Council's control and, in the interim, two temporary Portaloos have been hired for use by the public.

During the Winter months, the Public Toilets will be opened by 7.00 am each morning and closed between 4.30 pm and 5.00 pm. The Unit will be cleaned and checked throughout the day, but to report a problem, please contact the Parish Council Offices.

It is anticipated that these will be presented to the Schools in March 2022.

A copy of the Official Commemorative Programme of Events will be delivered to every household in the Village, with the Parish Council's Annual Newsletter, during May 2022 – In time for everyone to be fully aware of all of the Events that will be taking place, where and when, before, during and after the Jubilee Weekend!

The plan is that there will be something going on, not only during the Jubilee Weekend, but also in the days leading up to and after it for the whole community to enjoy – So, keep your diaries free and get ready for a hectic beginning to June 2022!

Rustington Youth Club




Christmas Shopping Event
