The next exciting Event is going to be the Rustington Street Fayre, organised by the Littlehampton District Lions Club, Rustington Chamber of Trade and Commerce and the Parish Council, working in partnership. This will be held on Saturday 8 June. There is a more detailed article later in this Newsletter, and further information will be issued over the next few months.

2019/2020 Parish Council Tax

Each year the Parish Council spends money on various local services and that money is part of the Council Tax you pay to the Arun District Council. The money raised is called the Precept. At this time of year, the Council has to consider the level of this Precept and it has decided that it must set its 2019/2020 Precept at £616,000 an estimated increase of 7.69% on 2018/2019.

This decision will result in an annual Parish Council charge on a Band 'D' property in Rustington being approximately £101.42, an increase of £7.14p on the previous year, equating to under 60p per week.

The Council very much regrets the need for this increase but, like everyone else, it is not immune to increasing financial pressures. However, parishioners should be assured that it will continue to strive to achieve ever improved efficiency and value for money in its operation, whilst doing its best to maintain the local services that are appreciated by residents and visitors alike.

These services include the maintenance and daily operation of The Woodlands Centre, the Woodlands Recreation Ground, the Rustington Youth Centre, the Woodland Park Sportsfield, over 150 Allotment Plots, Bus and Beach Shelters, Public Seats, the War Memorial, 4 Public Toilet Units, a School Crossing Patrol, some Street Lighting, the continued enhancement and maintenance of all floral and planted displays throughout the Village, the new and enhanced Christmas Lighting Scheme and Grants to local Organisations. The Council also funds, in partnership with the Rustington Chamber of Trade and Commerce and Store Property Investments Limited, the No. 12 Bus Service.

The Samuel Wickens Centre, which is managed by the Parish Council, at the rear of the Waitrose Supermarket, opened in May 2018. It is now home to the Village Information Centre, a hireable Community Hall and, by October 2019, the Museum will have moved from Church Farm Cottage

in The Street to the Centre. Unfortunately, Church Farm Cottage has yet to be sold, having been on the market for over a year, but the Council has recently entered into a joint estate agency agreement, and it is hoped that this will result in the sale of the property during the next financial year, if not before.

The Museum has now closed to allow time for the furniture, equipment and artefacts to be audited and packed up ready for the move to the Samuel Wickens Centre. As a result, it is anticipated that the running costs of the property will decrease over the next few months, which might result in the Council being able to reduce its 2020/2021 Precept accordingly.

The main reason for the increase in the 2019/2020 Precept is to ensure that the Council can repay the £100,000 donation made towards the setting up of the Museum at Church Farm Cottage by Store Property Investments Limited, that formed a part of the 10 Year Lease Conditions for the Samuel Wickens Centre, for which only a peppercorn rent is payable.

Taking account of all of this information, I still believe that your Parish Council continues to provide excellent value for money for its residents and, at the same time, works in close partnership with the local community to ensure that Rustington maintains its reputation as a most vibrant and pleasant place to live.

Residents have an opportunity to find out much more about how the Council has spent its share of the Council Tax during the past year, and how it plans to spend its Precept during the next financial year at the Annual Assembly of the Parish Meeting which will be held on Thursday 11 April 2019 in the Village Memorial Hall at the Woodlands Centre commencing at 7.30 pm.

Rustington Museum at the Samuel Wickens Centre



The story of Rustington Village is fascinating. Can you help us bring these stories to life?

Rustington Museum's new home in the specially created Exhibition Gallery at the Samuel Wickens Centre is planned to open in October 2019. Supported through the Heritage Lottery Fund (HLF), the Project will enable the Rustington Museum to retell the story of the history of the Village.

The Museum is currently closed as we need to pack up the objects we've had on display and transfer them to the new Gallery. At the new Museum we are busy choosing objects and writing text to retell the story of Rustington. We are working closely with Exhibition Designer,

David O'Connor, to make sure the display is fresh and engaging for our visitors.

The Project provides the opportunity to renew, redisplay and reimagine the story of Rustington focusing on stories of local people, highlighting key buildings and places in the Village. Our new displays will encourage opportunities for interaction and engagement by incorporating personal stories from local people, films showcasing local stories and low-tech inter-actives. Alongside the displays we will have a varied programme of community activities for everyone.

We need your help with this, and we are looking for volunteers to work alongside us at this exciting time.

You can help in a number of different ways:-

- Be an **Oral History Volunteer** - you will record interviews, write summaries, and select and edit audio
- Take part in the development of the exhibitions and resources as a **Research Volunteer**
- Interested in technology? We need people to become **Digital Volunteers** - assisting with the creation of an inter-active resource exploring the history of the streets of Rustington
- Do you have an interest in encouraging people to learn about Village life? Then you could be a **Learning Volunteer**, helping to deliver our community programme.

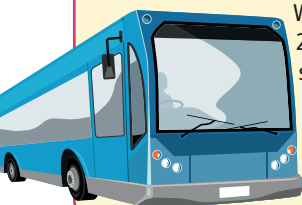

Number 12 Bus Service

Once again, the Council would like to remind parishioners of the existence of the No. 12 Bus Service, which operates from Monday to Friday. The route serves Rustington Sainsbury's Superstore and Rustington Village Centre, the Manor Retail Park (Next, ALDI, Tapi Carpets and BMW) and Worthing Road, Rustington. It then continues to Littlehampton, serving the Swimming and Leisure Centre, Littlehampton Railway Station and the Tesco Superstore at Broadpiece, Littlehampton.



With effect from 15 April 2019, the timetable for the service will change, to ensure a split in timings between the No. 9 and No. 12 Services, as follows:-

Councillors' Surgeries

Rustington Youth Club



The Youth Club is open 7.00 pm-9.00 pm every Thursday, including half-terms and summer holidays, for young people aged between 11-17 years to find help and advice, and a safe place to be alongside access to games consoles, pool/table tennis, a chill-out space, and arts/crafts. Each week there is a tuck shop and an ongoing programme including cooking, movie nights, inflatables, theme nights, and sports. The cost of entry is FREE for the first time, then 50p per session. You can also bring a friend to the Club that hasn't been before, and you will BOTH get in for FREE that week.

Each session is staffed by teams of experienced youth workers and volunteers who through the various activities, encourage young people to develop positive behaviours and life skills, raise self-confidence, remain in education and set goals and work hard to achieve them.

The Club is a partnership between Rustington Parish Council and Arun Youth Projects. The Youth Centre, where the Club takes place, is owned by the Parish Council and sited at the Woodlands Recreation Ground. Arun Youth Projects took over running youth activities in 2012 and has built a consistent relationship with many young people that have attended the Youth Club. They also plan and deliver programmes related to areas such as health, fitness, smoking, drugs, relationships and bullying.
