## Rustington-In-Bloom

It seems incredible that another judging day for South & South East in Bloom has come and gone. Everyone involved was delighted that once again our Village looked beautiful with all the glorious floral displays. We always hope for a lovely Summer's day when the judges arrive, but this year it was not to be. However, the judges, Mick Gore, on his second visit, and Brian Jeffries a newcomer to the Village, both seemed duly impressed as they walked through the Village Centre. Of course, it will not be until mid-September, when we attend the Awards' Ceremony, that we shall know what they really felt.

In-Bloom gives the opportunity to both Celebrate and Commemorate Events. The theme this year was one of Celebration, with the floral displays reflecting the 90th Birthday of Her Majesty the Queen. The 'Flower Birthday Cake' creates a talking point, as does the Sculptured Wooden Soldier standing in a beautiful flower bed. The Soldier was sited in 2014 to commemorate the 100 Year Anniversary of the start of the First World War. Perhaps this year he is a more poignant reminder of the 'day Sussex died' as the Royal Sussex Regiment lost over 350 men at the Battle of Boar's Head, which was on the eve of the start of The Battle of the Somme.

The Village Contractors, Ferring Nurseries, used the theme 'Celebration' to influence their planting with soft pastel colours, reflecting the dignity and dedication of the Queen's life. Although at her Birthday Celebrations she did wear a rather bright neon green outfit!

Kathleen Tidbury and I went to Georgian Gardens School to present

prizes to the winners of the Committee's Art Competition titled 'The 150th Birthday of Beatrix Potter' and Beach Sculptures. The Committee was very impressed with the quality and creativity of the pupils' work. The work forms part of their Arts' Award organised by Trinity College London.

The Committee is also delighted that there are now five groups who enter the South & South East in Bloom 'It's Your Neighbourhood' Competition. In future years, it would be encouraging if other Neighbourhoods in the Village would decide to develop a small area to enhance that environment, not only for their pleasure but for others too. Those Neighbourhoods already involved find that there is a reduction in litter and graffiti, with respect for the area and for those who are involved in the work.



Our Village is looking beautiful with an amazing array of flowers giving pleasure to not only those of us who live here, but to visitors too. A radio commentator who lives in Worthing, I am told, frequently refers on his programme to the wonderful floral displays in Rustington. Yes, we are truly fortunate to live here.
