

Chairman's Message

As I write this we are in the middle of a very wet Winter, which has us all dreaming of better weather and looking forward to the Spring.

Reflecting back on Rustington since the last Newsletter, we have had the Village Christmas Event, which saw volunteers and Charities brave the dreadful weather, whilst still being able to produce an Event in which the Schools and Scouts turned out to show exactly what Rustington is all about, as well as raising much needed funds in the process.

At the Community Carol Concert in December, we were lucky enough to hear outstanding performances from the Littlehampton Concert Band, Sussex West County Guide Choir and Friendship Singers. There was also a Charity Auction and Collection, where our community raised £956.65 for my chosen Charity, Guildcare.

At this point, I really do want to acknowledge the ever increasing success of the Youth Club which is operated for the Council by ACCelerate. Weekly attendance numbers have recently peaked at 50, and I am very proud that the Club is flourishing amidst the backdrop of all of the cutbacks in Local Government.

Turning now to the, currently under construction, Retail Park on the A259 (New Road). It is understood that the Chandlers BMW unit will be operational by August, with the construction of the other two units commencing very soon.

I hope that many of you have taken the time to look at the A259 proposals, recently exhibited as part of the Public Consultation, at drop-in sessions in Littlehampton, Angmering and Rustington, and that you have been able to have a say in this proposed Road Improvement Scheme. The Scheme will include junction improvements and the dualling of stretches of single carriageway.

That's all from me for now but, in closing, I would like to take this opportunity to thank you, the Parishioners, for your continuing support of the Council and its efforts to ensure the Village remains a most vibrant place in which to live. To quote one of my predecessors, 'an exceptional Village, with a reputation envied by many!'

2016/2017 Parish Council Tax

For the past five years, the Parish Council's annual charge on a Band 'D' property has remained largely unchanged at a yearly average of £88.39. I am sorry to tell you that a slight increase has been necessary for the forthcoming financial year ending 31 March 2017. The Council has set its 2016/2017 Precept at £537,000.00, which means that the annual Parish Council charge on a Band 'D' property in Rustington will be £90.04, an increase of £2.27 over the previous year. This total Band 'D' charge equates to £1.73 per week.

The Council regrets the need for this increase but it, like everyone else, is beset by inflationary pressures and coupled with a third year's reduction in the Arun District Council's Localisation of Council Tax Support Grant, has not found it possible to keep the Parish Precept at its current level. Last year the Council was able to keep its Parish Precept at the previous year's level. This was

achieved by a combination of a reduction in the Council's Reserves and certain efficiency savings. Unfortunately this is becoming more and more difficult.

However, the Council will continue to strive to achieve ever improved efficiency and value for money in its operation, while doing its best to protect the local services that are so appreciated by residents and visitors alike.

Projects planned for 2016/2017 include a new use for the delightful building that previously housed The Garden Café at the rear of the Museum, now to be known as The Garden Room; the installation of the bus shelter in the vicinity of the Westcourt Medical Centre in The Street, as previously advised; new 'brown' Village Information Signage, the replacement of the remaining tiered wooden planter at Broadmark Parade with a new planter and benches; further improvements at The Woodlands Centre

and Recreation Ground, and the major roofing repair works that have recently been undertaken to The Woodlands Centre building.

I believe that the Council provides excellent 'value for money' for its parishioners and, at the same time, works in partnership with the local Community to ensure that Rustington maintains its reputation as a most vibrant and pleasant place to live.

Local residents, as always, will have an opportunity to find out much more about how the Council has spent its Precept during the past year, and how it plans to spend its Precept during the next financial year at the Annual Assembly of the Parish Meeting which will be held on Thursday 14 April in the Village Memorial Hall at The Woodlands Centre commencing at 7.30 pm.

Loo of the Year Awards

At the Loo of the Year Awards, held in December, the Churchill Parade Public Toilets won the award for Best Car Park Toilets in the country.

The overall quality of Rustington's Public Toilets, with one platinum-rated and three gold-rated units, put

it 20th in the 'Local Authority Public Toilet Premier League' (joint with the City of Lincoln).

Running since 1987, the Awards, presented at a Ceremony in Solihull, seek 'to encourage the highest possible standards in all away-from-home or Public Toilets'.

Inspectors judged toilets on a variety of criteria, from basic cleanliness to the quality of décor and maintenance.
