A new home for the Museum, Village Information Centre and The Garden Room

In August, the Council announced that, courtesy of a most generous offer from Store Property Investments Limited, Rustington Museum, The Garden Room and the Village Information Centre would be moving from their current locations to the ex WRVS Building in the Car Park behind the Waitrose Store, as soon as major renovation works have been carried out.

Store Property Investments Limited made the offer of a Lease to the Council, as they are anxious to see this building used as a community facility for residents and visitors to the Village. It is anticipated that the facility will be fully operational early/mid 2018.

The Council's existing members of personnel will all be working in the new building, which is to be named 'The Samuel Wickens Centre'.

This new Community Centre will also provide an additional private hiring facility

and garden for local Groups, Clubs and Organisations, with a number of drop-in Tea and Coffee dedicated sessions being planned for the benefit of the local community.

As far as the Museum is concerned, the Council is working closely with the Rustington Heritage Association, to ensure that this facility, will not only continue to portray and protect the Village's heritage, but will also be able to be enhanced further with additional displays, to ensure that visitors will be able to enjoy the 'Museum Experience'.

The Museum, and all associated land, is currently being marketed for sale. The proceeds, following repayment of all loans associated with the Museum and The Garden Room, will then be retained for use in a future capital project. The Council is confident that this project will result in much needed revenue cost efficiencies in trying financial times.

The Council is well aware that the Museum, The Garden Room and Community Garden have provided excellent and unique facilities within the Village, where people have been able to gather and socialise, but considers that the move to these new premises will enable this valuable function to continue and expand.

The Museum and Information Centre, once officially open, will operate between the hours of 9.00 am and 5.00 pm, Monday to Saturday.

The Council is most excited to have this opportunity which, it is certain will be most successful and will not only raise the profile most positively of the services that will be housed within the Centre, but will also ensure that the facilities are socially inclusive for all to enjoy.





Annual Civic Thanksgiving Service and Community Awards' Reception

The Parish Council hosted its Annual Thanksgiving Service on Sunday 10 September, at St Andrew's United Reformed Church.

Guests included Sir Peter Bottomley MP, Councillor Mrs Jacqueline Pendleton, Chairman of the Arun District Council, and a number of other Chairmen, Mayors and Councillors from neighbouring Councils. The Service was conducted by The Reverend Canon David Helyar.

Following the Service, the Community Awards' Reception was held at The Woodlands Centre, where presentations were made to various members of the community, both for outstanding floral displays in private front gardens and business premises and also for excellently cultivated allotment plots.

One of the highlights of the evening was the Presentation of the Individual Parishioners' Awards.

A new trophy was introduced this year, to be awarded on an annual basis to the winners of the Individual Parishioners' Award. The Trophy, appropriately named The Austen Beard Trophy, in memory of Austen and in recognition of his outstanding and unceasing commitment to the local Community, was presented by his daughter, Mrs Stephanie Ashdown.

The first recipient of the Individual Parishioners' Award, was Mr Richard Mann (Dickie), who sadly passed away in August. His son Clive, daughter-in-law Pat, and two





of his grandchildren, received the Award on his behalf.

The Award was made to Richard in recognition of his outstanding service and devotion to the local sporting community, and in particular, Rustington Cricket Club for over half a Century, as well as his unceasing commitment to supporting the community of Rustington.

The second recipient of the Individual Award was Mrs Patricia Hayes, in recognition of her dedication, commitment and outstanding service to the Rustington Women's Institute, Rustington Methodist Church, together with voluntary groups and organisations both within and in close proximity to the Parish for the benefit of the community of Rustington.

Rustington-In-Bloom - Another Gold Award and...

In the 'It's Your Neighbourhoods' Category, the Coastal Workshop, Oakhurst Gardens, Rustington Hall, the Methodist Church Garden, The Chaucery Memorial and The Hidden



Twitten each received 'Outstanding' Awards. Such impressive and rewarding results for all involved!

The whole community, once again, pulled out all the stops with its support for the In-Bloom Campaign, by helping to ensure that all areas of the judging criteria were met and exceeded and, in recognition of this, Certificates of Excellence were awarded to a number of Groups, Clubs, Organisations and Individuals for their most important contributions towards the success.

As always, the Members of the In-Bloom Committee, in partnership with the Parish Council, organised the 2017 Campaign and were most grateful for the support of the Arun District Council Cleansing and Parks Department, together with other individual Officers from the District Council.

As always, special thanks and appreciation must be conveyed to Ferring Nurseries, without whose outstanding service, expertise and dedication, this remarkable success would most certainly not have been attained.

We have received an enquiry from a small Village in Brittany asking if we would like to be twinned with them. The Village is small in comparison to Rustington and this would be their first twinning experience.

Rustington Community Primary School and Florenberg School, Künzell, and Darlington Court Care Home and Haus Stephanus, Künzell, are good examples. Although learning or keeping up with other languages is another benefit, it is not necessary to speak the language to be involved.

In order to accommodate another active twinning partner, we would need to form two Sub-Committees, for Germany and France, and would be looking for volunteers to fill some of these roles.

As most of you will already be aware, it is anticipated that the Museum will be relocating to new premises sometime in 2018. This will be both a challenge, and a great opportunity. The history of the Village will still be showcased, and the Museum will be able to exhibit and honour many more of its famous landmarks and people.

Creating a new Exhibition means much research, including interviewing contributors, calculating floor space dimensions, arranging cabinets and contents, and organising storyboards, all before any display can be opened and marketed. So, exciting and busy times ahead

Looking forward, we propose to honour two great Centenaries in 2018. Firstly, the

success, after a long campaign, to secure voting rights for women - many leading lights in this campaign had strong links to Rustington. Secondly, in October, we will commemorate the Centenary of Sir Hubert Parry's death. He lived in Rustington (Knightscroft House) with his beloved wife Maud. Famous not only for the 'Jerusalem' hymn, but he also spoke fluent German, greatly admiring the German Composers and Opera. He also loved sailing, and had one of the first cars in the Village. He and Maud were ardent supporters of the Suffrage Movement.

There will be other Exhibitions and Displays throughout the year, so come and visit. You may be surprised how rich and interesting the history of Rustington is.

The Garden Room has been kept busy with regular groups, including the Thursday Platinum Club, a weekly get together enabling the over 50's to participate in crafts, games or to just have a chat and cup of tea in the company of their caring host, Annet. Creative Art Workshops, and Rustington Walking Group also have regular bookings. All of these activities and groups will continue in the new building.

We look forward to seeing you all next year in our new home.

Rustington Youth Club

The Youth Centre is a venue for young people aged between 11 - 17 years. Open every Thursday evening during term time. It offers a variety of activities including pool, table tennis, air hockey, video games consoles, sports, art and more. Each week there is also a tuck shop and an ongoing programme including cooking, movie nights, inflatables, theme nights, and sports. This Term we've made milkshakes, had a chicken nuggets' night and started a doodling and 'mindfulness' activity. Still to come before Christmas is a 'learn to draw' evening and henna, then following half-term, we'll be having some festive sessions such as sparklers, soup and Christmas craft. The programme is fun, varied, and young people have an active role in planning future sessions.

The Club is a partnership between Rustington Parish Council and ACCelerate - the youth work of Arun Community Church. The Youth Centre, where the Club takes place, is owned by the Parish Council and sited at the Woodlands Recreation Ground. ACCelerate took over running youth activities at the Centre in 2012 and has built a consistent relationship with many young people that have attended the Youth Club.

The Club has a great team of staff and



volunteers committed to seeing young people included and supported. The whole team is committed to making a difference to the lives of young people and is able to assess the needs of young people in order to plan and deliver programmes related to areas such as health, fitness, smoking, drugs, relationships and bullying.

The Youth Club is open from 6.00 pm to 8.00 pm (term time only with trips planned for half-terms) and the cost of entry is FREE for the first time, then 50p per session. You can also bring a friend to the Club that hasn't been before and you will BOTH get in for FREE that week.
